

### **MID-WEEK PENNANTS - MEN**

In the Men's event our Grade 1 won the Pennant in the inaugural year of the Men's Mid-Week event. The team finished on top of the ladder with a game in hand. Due to the need to reschedule matches called off by rain, the Grade 1 side played double headers on November 2 and 9 against Queanbeyan RSL and the then ladder leaders North Canberra, respectively. Against RSL they picked up 13 of a possible 16 points (6 and 7) and 14 of a possible 16 points against North Canberra (8 and 6) to take a 5 point lead at the top of the ladder.

North Canberra needed to beat RSL in the last round to give themselves a chance of winning the Pennant but could only manage a draw. This meant that Vikings' last game of the season, which was cancelled due to hail (see photo), did not need to be rescheduled.

Our Grade 2 side finished in third spot.

### **MID-WEEK PENNANTS - WOMEN**

Mid-Week Pennants have been completed with our Women's teams finishing in third spot in Grade 1. Going into the last match of the season, a rescheduled match due to an early season washout, they needed to win at least one rink comprehensively or draw against Canberra Bowling Club. However, Canberra proved too strong taking out the match 43-29, winning both rinks and as a result winning the Pennant.

We had two teams competing in Grade 2, with Vikings 2 finishing in second spot and Vikings 3 in fifth.

### **VICE PRESIDENT LYNNE'S REPORT**

This will be a brief overview of three services Catering; Corporate Bowls and Bookings I am responsible for and there has been some changes in the practices the way we deliver these services.

I have written a Manual for each one and placed the master copy in the office for all members to view; Catering Manual -Green folder; Corporate Bowls -Black Folder; Bookings -Red folder.

### Catering

The Vikings Town Centre now does their own catering In-house. Therefore, the way we did our catering has changed in the requirements the Town Centre wants us to deliver catering to our members. All catering is now in accordance with the Legislative ACT Health Act and Food Safety ACT and is limited to the following Canteen services only.

- 1 Heat and Serve e.g. Pie warmer
- 2 BBQ
- 3 Cold meat /salad and fruit meals
- 4 Morning Teas -coffee /tea stations

Most importantly, it is a requirement that any volunteer who handles foods must have a Basic Food Safety certificate.

Non-certificate holders can still do other duties e.g. kitchen.

If you wish to volunteer by helping out with food service and preparation, don't be put off, it is easy to get a certificate.

You can get your certificate online at accessrt.edu.au. Click on food safety. Once you have completed the course let us know and the bowling club will reimburse you cost of the certificate. A copy of your certificate will be held on file in the office.

### **Corporate Bowls**

In this folder there is a copy of Job description for Administrator, which I currently am doing and for Duty Officer, which is currently Baden Clark.


All relevant documentation and bookings and Running Summary Spread Sheet of bookings are also held here.

### **BOOKINGS**

All bookings are done on a monthly basis, one month in advance.

This includes Umpire, Greenkeeper overtime, and Greenkeeper, Rooms, Bar Catering, Match, Tournaments, BACT events and Functions. A monthly running sheet is included.

If any member wishes to book extra e.g. coaching rink availability or other requirements, there is a monthly blank calendar, fill in and you will be added to booking

### This month's player profile is BOB BEST

### **Early Days**

Bob was born in Sydney in 1946. At the age of 10 the family moved to Campbelltown where Bob. During his school years Bob played Rugby and competed in athletics, where he specialised in high jump. Bob loved it so much he built his own high jump in the family backyard so he could practice at home.

### **Work Life**

Bob was keen to become a carpenter like his father but his father wanted Bob to get a job working in an office. Around the age of 15, Bob commenced his first job working for a bank in Cobargo in NSW. This didn't last long, as not long after commencing Bob's best and closest friend was killed by a train. Bob was devasted and wanted to move back home.

He then commenced work as a Customs Agent in Sydney. But after two years he parted company with Customs as he felt that he was never meant to work in an office.

This time his father relented and Bob went to work with his father as a carpenter.

#### **CMF**

Bob missed out on National Service but he liked the military, so he enlisted in the CMF (Citizen Military Forces). He liked all aspects of the CMF but particularly the use of firearms. He was a good shot as he had his own rifle and used to do target shooting but the CMF gave him the opportunity to use an SLR rifle, Owen Machine Gun and the pistol. He once picked up the award as the best shot in the company.

### Age 24-50

By this time Bob had married and moved to Picton. Here he played tennis and was involved in two service clubs, Apex and Rotary. Bob liked being in the service clubs as he is always keen to help others in the community, in whatever way he can.

After a few years he moved back to Campbelltown for work purposes. By this time, he was a building contractor working for the NSW Housing Commission.

### Age 50 - Present

At the age of 50 due to medical issues Bob was forced into early retirement.

### **Bowls**

He and his wife moved to Lake Munmorah to the Lakeside Leisure Village on the Central Coast. It was here that Bob took up lawn bowls and it wasn't long before he was running the show, organising all the bowls events at the Village. A little while later he joined the Gwandalan Bowling Club where he was one of the top bowlers in the club, specialising as a lead. In 2013, he took out the Bowler of the Year Award. This

award is points based with points awarded for each of the Club's championships. In 2013, Bob was a member of the successful Triples team, and runner up in the Club Fours and Singles.

### Canberra and Vikings

When Bob's wife passed away as a result of cancer his son suggested that Bob should move to Canberra. He agreed and has put a granny flat on his son's property in Banks.

On moving to Canberra, Bob wanted to continue his bowling and joined TVBC, where he still enjoys a good game and has made many new friends. He enjoys the company of his fellow bowlers and the good standard but friendly competition at Vikings.

Bob has also joined the Tuggeranong Over 55s Club where he regularly plays 500 and carpet bowls.

### Highlights of Bob's Life

Bob has had many highlights during his life but two that stand out for him were on Royal Australian Navy ships.

Bob's son was an officer in the Navy and was able to invite Bob to participate on two four-day cruises onboard two guided missile frigates. He sailed from Sydney to Melbourne onboard the Canberra and from Townsville to Sydney on the Melbourne.

On the Canberra, the Captain invited Bob to steer the frigate for an hour. While Bob was presented with a Helmsmen Certificate for his efforts, the captain did say that he hoped Bob steered a car better than he did the ship.

Another highlight of his life was to fly over the Canadian Rockies in a helicopter.
